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CHAPTER-I INTRODUCTION

Maharshi Dayanand University, established in 1976 as a residential University with the objectives of promoting studies in the fields of Life Sciences, Environmental and Ecological Sciences, has entered the thirty-fourth year of its existence. It is now functioning as a teaching-cum-affillating University having 35 Post-Graduate Departments, a Directorate of Distance Education, a Post Graduate Regional Centre at Rewari, 447 affilliated Colleges and an Institute of Law and Management Studies, Gurgaon.

Facilities for Doctoral Research in the subjects of Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Political Science, Public Administration, Sociology, History, Economics, Mathematics, Physics Chemistry, Law, Geography, Psychology, Education, Music, Defence and Strategic Studies, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Medical Sciences and Engg. & Technology are available.

(A) Reservation of Seats for Bonafide Residents of Haryana

The seats shall be reserved for the candidates in these categories :-

i) Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes : 20%
ii) Backward Classes : 27%
Block-A : 16%
Block-B : 11%
(except socially advanced persons/sections i.e. Creamy-Layer)

iii) Physically Handicapped : 3%

(Blindness or low vision 1% Hearing impairment 1% Locomotor disability or Cerebralpalsy 1%)

- **Note 1**: The State Govt. vide letter No 22/27/2004-2GS-III date 20-10-2005 has decided to allow 3% horizontal reservation to Ex-servicemen/ freedom fighters and their dependants by providing reservation within reservation of 1% general category, 1% out of Scheduled Castes and 1% from Backward Classes category for admission to the various educational institution of the Govt. and Govt. aided/ self financing colleges/ Institutes located in Haryana. As far as block allocation in Block A and Block B. of Backward Classe categories is concerned, year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if blocks A of Backward Classes are given seats in the academic year 2008, the next block i.e. B Block of categories of Backward classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2009 and so on.
- **Note 2**: SC (A) and SC (B) categories have been clubbed in the light of instructions issued by the Chief Secretary, Haryana vide letter No. 22/8/2004-3 GS III dated 7-6-2007 (Appendix-G)
- **Note 3**: The reservation of seats is as per the reservation policy of the State Govt. and is subject to any change/ amendment by the State Govt. from time to time.

(B) Distribution of seats

The seats in each course shall be distributed as under :-

- 1. All India candidates including Haryana 15%
- 2. Bonafide Residents of Haryana 85%

(50% of the seats earmarked for bonafide residents of Haryana will be reserved for the categories as mentioned at (A) above as per State policy and remaining 50% seats will be filled from General category candidates.

- 1. The bonafide residents of Haryana have been defined in Appendix-A. The Certificate of Haryana Residence, as per guidelined given in Appendix-A, is required only in the proformae prescribed by the Govt. Specimen copies are available in Appendix-B.
- 2. The List of scheduled castes has been given in Appendix-G and backward classes (Block A & Block-B) in Appendix-E. Certificates of Scheduled Caste and Backward Classes are at Appendix 'C' & 'D' respectively.
- 3. The list of fake Universities / Boards has been given in Appendix 'H'. The candidates passing from these fake Universities / Boards are not eligible to seek admission in this University.

CHAPTER - 3 ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

(a) General Category

The candidates possessing the Bachelor's Degree in Pharmacy from AICTE approved institutions, with at least 55% marks, and VALID GPAT SCORE, shall be eligible for admission.

The admission shall be made on the basis of the MERIT prepared from the VALID GPAT SCORE only. If the candidates having a valid GPAT score are not available, these seats may be offered to NON-GPAT candidates, based upon the MERIT comprising of their aggregate marks in the B. Pharmacy examination only.

Note :

- 1. There will not be any age restriction.
- 2. Candidates belonging to reserved classes, with a VALID GPAT SCORE, will be considered in the same MERIT as for the general category seats.
- 3. Scholarship shall be admissible only to the candidates having a VALID GPAT SCORE. No scholarship shall be given to the NON-GPAT candidates admitted, if any, to the General Category Seats.
- 4. The mode of selection shall be MERIT on the basis of VALID GPAT SCORE only. In case two or more candidates have an equal GPAT score, preference shall be given to the one having a higher aggregate marks in the B.Pharmacy examination. If the aggregate marks in the B.Pharmacy examination are also same, preference shall be decided on the basis of seniority in age.
- 5. Candidates must submit the proof of a VAILD GPAT SCORE card and having passed the qualifying examination, i.e., B. Pharmacy, at the time of counselling.
- 6. The elgibility of the candidates shall be ascertained at the time of counselling. The candidates are advised to bring original certificates/ testimonials alongwith the attested copies of each from a Gazetted Officer.
- 7. No rounding off marks in Pharmacy Examination is admissible.
- 8. There is a likelihood of scholarships being paid by AICTE but the said scholarships shall be admissible only to the candidates having a VALID GPAT SCORE. No scholarship shall be given to the NON-GPAT candidates admitted, if any.

(B) Reserved Categories

A candidate who wishes to be considered for reserved category(ies) shall have to furnish a certificate issued by a competent authority. Specimen copies of the Certificate are appended in the Prospectus.

A candidate who applies for both reserved and general category will be first considered in the general category. In case he/she is not selected in the general category, he/she will be considered in the reserved category.

If the seats in the reserved category(ies) remain vacant, the same may be thrown open to General Category with the prior approval of the Vice-Chancellor.

Special Note :

If any candidate or his/ her parents or guardian are found to have submitted any false affidavit/ certificate, not only the candidate's admission will be cancelled. but the person filling the affidavit shall also be liable to be prosecuted in accordance with Criminal Law.

CHAPTER - 4 SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

 A copy of the prospectus containing admission form and other details can be obtained from office of the Incharge (Publication cell), M.D. University, Rohtak in person on payment of Rs. 500/- (Rs .125/- for SC/BC candidates of Haryana only) in cash. Request for prospectus through registered post must be received in the office of the Incharge (Publication cell) on or before 28.06.10 by sending Bank Draft of Rs. 550/- (Rs.175/- for SC/BC category candidates of Haryana only) in favour of the, Finance Officer M.D. University, Rohtak payable at State Bank of India M.D. University, Rohtak (Code No. 4734). Payment by Cheque, Money Order, I.P.O. or in any other form will not be accepted.

Prospectus and Application form can also be down-loaded from University Website www.mdurohtak.com and should be submitted alongwith a bank draft in favour of Finance officer, M.D. University, Rohtak payable at Rohtak for Rs. 500/- (Rs. 125/- for SC/BC candidates of Haryana only).

2. Each candidate shall fill up the admission form in his own hand-writing and send it under registered cover superscribed 'ADMISSION FORM FOR M.PHARMACY COURSE' to the Head, Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences, M.D. University, Rohtak, or submit it personality in the Department and take a receipt thereof by 05.07.2010 (up to 5.00 P.M.) The University does not take any responsibility for delay or loss of form or correspondence pertaining thereto in postal transit.

- 3. The candidates must read the prospectus carefully before filing up the application form.
- 4. A candidate who gets admission to this course shall not be eligible to seek admission to any other course in the University unless he/she withdraws from this course and vice-versa.
- 5. A candidate who is placed under compartment in the qualifying examination will not be allowed admission to M.Pharmacy course, in any case.

- 6. Application for admission to M.Pharmacy course, complete in all respects, must be accompanied by the following :-
- a) Four copies of the recent photograph (passport size) duly attested by the Principal/Head of the Institution last attended.
- b) Attested copy of Matriculation/Higher Secondary Certificate (for its equivalent) showing the date of birth of the candidate.
- c) Attested copies of the following certificates :-
- i) Having passed in qualifying examination, i.e. B. Pharmacy.
- ii) Valid GPAT Score
- iii) Certificates of good conduct/character from the Principal/Head of the Institution last attended.
- iv) Certificates pertaining to claims for reservations, if applicable
- v) Cetrificate of Haryana Resident if applicable.
- vi) The Counselling Board shall have the power to call for any document (s) from the candidate(s) in support of his/her claim and reject any certificate not considered valid. The decision of the Counselling Board in this regard shall be final.
- 8) The Candidates shall present themselves in person alongwith original documents, fees etc., for admission on the date and time of Counselling. If a candidate fails to appear before the Counselling Board with necessary documents and fee at the time of his/ her turn in the counseling, he/she shall forfeit his/her claim to admission.
- 9. The candidate admitted will be required to deposit fees on the same day. If a candidate does not deposit the fees/ dues within stipulated time limit, he/she shall forfeit his/ her claim for admission.
- 10. Any attempt on he part of a candidate, his/her friends or relatives to canvass or bring influence to bear upon the University directly or indirectly for securing admission will be a disqualification for admission.
- 11. No judicial proceedings will lie against the University/ Board of Counselling for :
 - a) any bonafide error that may occur in the selection of any candidate for admission.
 - b) rejection to any claim(s), whatsoever, of candidates of any category.
 - c) refusing to accept a certificate as equivalent to that specified;
 - d) rejecting a candidate without any reason for the same; and
 - e) any other reason pertaining to admission of candidates.
- 12. All the particulars in the application form must be written carefully and legibly. Applications which are incomplete in required particulars or enclosures will not be considered.
- 13. In case any candidate is found to have supplied false information or certificate etc. or is found to have withheld or concealed some information in his/her application form he/she be liable to be debarred from admission to Master of Pharmacy Course and if admitted, the admission shall be cancelled at any time.
- 14. The name of the student who remains absent from classes for more than 15 days at a stretch after admission, without genuine reasons and without the permission of the Head of Deptt., shall be struck off without any notice and the seat thus declared vacant may be given to the next candidate in waiting list provided such a candidate joins within 15 days from the last date of admission.

Note : Rules for refund of fee are available in University's Handbook of Information.

- 15. All admissions to the Master of Pharmacy course are provisional i.e. subject to their registration with the M.D. University, Rohtak after completing necessary requirements as per Rules and Ordinances.
- 16. The Candidate will have to deposit their fees and other dues as prescribed by the University within stipulated period.
- 17. The rules given herein are only provisional. These may be changed or modified by the University without prior notice. The candidate cannot make any claim on the basis of information given in the prospectus.
- 18. In case of any ambiguity in the rules, interpretation of the same by the Vice-Chancellor of M.D. University shall be final.
- 19. Candidates must have their original certificates, other required documents and a set of attested copies of the same with them at the time of counselling.

20. Prohibition of Ragging

The instruction for curbing ragging as conveyed by the UGC vide letter No. FA-I/ 97 (CPP-II) dated 7th July, 2001 in view of the judgement of Supreme Court in Civil Writ Petition No. 656 of 1998 ' Vishwa Jagriti Mission V/s Centre Govt.' given below shall be adhered to strictly :-

Ragging in educational institutions is banned and any one indulging in ragging is likely to be punished appropriately, which punishment may include expulsion from the Institute, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology. The punishment may also take the shape of (i) withholding scholarships or other benefits (ii) debarring from representation in events (iii) withholding results (iv) suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess, and the like.(v) lodging of FIR to local police. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not/ cannot be identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent.

Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other students, indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in freshers or junior students or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment, so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in SLP(C) No. 24295/2004 in the matter of University of Kerala V/S Council of Principals, Colleges of Kerala and others has ordered that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the Institution.

CHAPTER - 5

ORDINANCE FOR THE MASTER OF PHARMACY COURSE

- 1. There shall be a course leading to the Master of Pharmacy (M. Pharm.) degree in each of the following specializations, under the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences :
 - a. M. Pharm. Industrial Pharmacy
 - b. M. Pharm. Pharmaceutics (Drug Regulatory Affairs)
 - c. M. Pharm. Pharmaceutical Chemistry
 - d. M. Pharm. Pharmacognosy
 - e. M. Pharm. Pharmacology
 - 2. The duration of the course for the degree of Master of Pharmacy shall be of four semesters, spread over two academic years. An academic year shall be divided into two semesters, each semester extending to about 14-16 weeks. The first academic year will consist of first and second semester and the second academic year will consist of third & fourth semester. At the end of the each semester, there shall be an examination wherein candidates will be examined in the courses prescribed for that semester and the semester examination shall be designated as First Semester Examination, Second Semester Examination, Third Semester Examination and Fourth Semester Examination, respectively. The examination for all semesters will normally be held in Dec./Jan. and also in May/June, OR on such dates as may be fixed by the University. The thesis work will start from Third Semester and Third & Fourth Semesters will be devoted to Thesis Work, Seminar, etc..
 - 3. A candidate seeking admission to M. Pharm. course must have passed the Bachelor of Pharmacy examination with at least 55 % marks from M.D. University, Rohtak, or any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent thereto and must possess a valid GPAT score. In case GPAT qualified students are not available, the seats will be open to the other candidates on merit basis, on the basis of aggregate score of B. Pharmacy.
 - 4. A candidate registered for the course shall not be deemed to have satisfied the required condition of the attendance until he/she has attended not less than 75 % of theory lectures and practicals separately in each subject, in order to be eligible for appearing in First / Second / Third / Fourth Semester Main Examination, at the end of each semester. Relaxation in attendance, if any, shall be according to the rules and regulations of the University. The last date for receipt of examination forms without and with late fees shall be fixed by Vice Chancellor and notified by the Controller of Examinations.
 - 5. In each examination, whether theory/practical/viva voce, etc., a candidate must secure 50 % marks to qualify the said examination. For the purpose of promotion, the theory and practical examination of any one subject will be considered as separate papers. For promotion from First Semester to Second Semester, a candidate must have passed at least 03 papers (out of a total of 04 theory and 02 practicals, taken together). Similarly, for promotion from Second to Third Semester, a candidate must have passed all the papers of First Semester and at least 03 papers of the Second Semester OR at least 08 papers (out of 12 papers of First & Second Semester, taken together). For promotion from Third to Fourth Semester, a candidate must secure at least 50 % marks in the Third Semester Main Examination, and must have passed at least 10 papers (out of 12 papers of First & Second Semester). Supplementary Examination for the First Semester shall be held in Dec./Jan. and Second Semester Supplementary Examination shall be held in May/June, or on such dates as may be prescribed by the University. A

candidate must clear all papers within 3 attempts.

- 6. All the theory papers shall be set by external examiners in accordance with the procedure laid down by the University. The theory answer sheets shall be evaluated by the examiner who has set the question paper. In each practical paper, there shall be at least one External Examiner and one Internal Examiner (concerned subject teacher within the department). The panel of external examiners for the theory / practicals shall be recommended by the Board of Studies. However, in case an external examiner is not available for setting of theory question paper / evaluation of theory answer sheets / conducting the practical examination, the Chairman, Board of Studies may be authorized to appoint a substitute examiner, from within the department / outside from any neighbouring colleges / University.
- 7. 10 marks in each Theory paper will be reserved for internal assessment. In theory, these marks will be based upon the average of marks obtained during two sessional examinations conducted during the First / Second Semester. In case of practicals, these marks will be based upon the day-to-day assessment of the practical work.

05 marks in each Theory and Practical papers shall be awarded on the basis of attendance, in First and Second Semester, respectively.

35 marks in each Theory paper in First and Second Semester, respectively shall be reserved for the Main Examination. The pattern of each Theory paper in First & Second Semester, shall be as follows :

- 8. A candidate must pass M. Pharmacy examination in not more than 3 years from the date of admission.
- 9. A candidate shall be examined according to the scheme of examinations and syllabus as approved by the Academic Council from time to time.
- 10. A candidate after the completion of FOURTH SEMESTER, shall submit at least five printed, type written or reprographed copies of his/her thesis, along with the examination fees as prescribed by the University from time to time. Thesis shall be submitted within 30 days after the date fixed by the Head of the department. Last date for submission of thesis may be extended upto 3 months by Dean of the Faculty, on the recommendation of the supervisor(s) through the Head of the Department. For any further relaxation, the case may be referred to the Vice Chancellor for approval.

- 11. Distribution of the students amongst various supervisors as well as approval of the title of the thesis shall be carried out by a Committee comprising of all the teachers involved in post-graduate teaching, of the concerned specialization, in the Department. The HOD of the concerned Department shall be the Chairman of this committee. Dean of the Faculty shall be an ex-officio member of this committee.
- 12. The evaluation of Research Work Synopsis at the end of the THIRD SEMESTER and the thesis for M. Pharm. (FOURTH SEMESTER) examination shall be done by a board consisting of
 - p One External Examiner
 - p Internal Examiner(s) [Research Supervisor(s) of the candidate].
 - p Dean of the Faculty, and
 - p Head of the Department.

The evaluation shall be based on the contents of the research work synopsis / thesis, its presentation and discussion thereon.

- 13. A candidate whose thesis for M. Pharm. (FOURTH SEMESTER examination) has been rejected may be allowed to resubmit thesis after a period of three months from the date of declaration of results, but not later than 3 years from the date of admission of the candidate in the M. Pharmacy. Any such candidate shall have to pay penal fees, as may be prescribed by the University, from time to time.
- 14. The medium of the instruction and examination shall be English.
- 15. The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be as under :
 - i. 50 % in theory paper (including sessional and attendance).
 - ii. 50 % in practical paper (including sessional and attendance).
 - iii. 50 % in thesis.
 - iv. 50 % in aggregate.

The successful candidates shall be classified into three divisions obtained by the candidate and the same will be indicated in their degree, as given below :

- i. Candidate who passes all the Semester Examinations, obtaining 75 % or more marks of the total aggregate, shall be declared to have passed with Distinction.
- ii. Those who obtain 60 % or more of the aggregate number of marks in all the subjects in M. Pharmacy examination, shall be placed in the First Division.
- iii. Those who obtain 50 % or more but less than 60 % marks in all subjects in M. Pharm. examination, shall be placed in Second Division.
- 16. There will be no improvement facilities to Master of Pharmacy students. However, the grace marks will be allowed as per University Rules.
- 17. A candidate will be required to pay examination fees as per University Rules.
- 18. Notwithstanding the integrated nature of the Master of Pharmacy course, which is spread over more than one academic year, the ordinance in force at the time a student joins the course, shall hold good only for the examination(s) held during or at the end of the academic year and nothing in these Ordinances subsequently and the amended Ordinance, if any, shall apply to all the students whether old or new.

Selected students are required to deposit their dues directly with the State Bank of India, Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak by submitting a challan form, in triplicate, available at banks' counter duly filled in. They should get the dues verified by the University Cashier before depositing the dues with Bank.
- 2. Tuition Fee and other monthly dues will be payable for 12 months in the year, i.e., from June to May in one instalment at the beginning of the session.

- 4 The University has right to revise the rates of fee funds during the course of study.

Copy of letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3.10.96 from the Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana, Chandigarh and addressed to all Head of Departments, Commissioners, Ambala, Rohtak, Gurgaon and Hisar Division, All Deputy Commissioners & All Sub Divisional Officers in Haryana, Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court and all Districts Sessions Judges in Haryana.

Subject : Bonafide Residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institutions (including technical/ medical institutions). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgement delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pardeep Jain Vs Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth the following categories of person would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:-

- i) Candidates who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana;
- ii) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants:
 - a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or Working on deputation;
 - b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana;
 - c) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government.
- iii) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the state of Haryana.
- iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of pensioners of Haryana Govt., irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
- v) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of persons who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
- vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
- viii) Children/wards of the accredited journalists residing at chandigarh and recognized by govt. of Haryana (added vide C.S. letter No. 62/27/2003-6 GSI dated 29/7/2003)

- vii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; Provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are:
 - a) citizens of India;
 - b) produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants have not obtained the benefit of domicile in any other State.
- 2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a **Haryana Resident Certificate** signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub Divisional Officer (Civil), Tehsildar (Revenue Department of the District/Sub Division to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificate in respect of the children/wards/dependants of Haryana Government employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of the children wards/dependants of the employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana and located at Chandigarh, in Haryana or outside Haryana, should be issued by their respective Heads of Department.
- 3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including Medical and Technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Head-Master from concerned institution where the children/ wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Head-Master of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate which should be sufficient.
- 4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time it is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution and all fees and other dues paid upto the date of such removal shall be confiscated. Principal/Head-Master may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
- 5. These instructions may kindly be noted carefully for compliance.
- **Note :** 1. The State Government vide letter no. 22/28/2003-3GS-III dated 30.1.2004 has decided that henceforth Circle Revenue Officers (Tehsildar/Naib Tehsildar-cum-Executive Magistrate concerned has been authorised to issue Resident as well as Caste Certificates (SC/BC/OBC) . In case of Haryana Govt. employees serving in the offices located at Chandigarh/Panchkula and residing at Chandigarh/Panchukula, the Resident Certificate and Caste Certificates to SC/BC employees and their children will be issued by their respective Heads of the Department. The proformae for these certificates have also been prescribed by the State Govt. (Appendix-A-I,B & C). Therefore, all the candidates required to submit such certificates in the prescribed proforma. The certificate issued by other than the competent authority or the proforma prescribed will not be accepted.
 - 2. Haryana Resident Certificate should be of after 30.01.2004. Certificates issued before this date will not be accepted. The candidates must ensure that they get certificate from appropriate authority Haryana Resident Certificates and not Haryana Domicile Certificate, the latter being invalid for the purpose of admission.

Copy of letter No. 1170-SW (I)-95 dated 7.6.95 received from the Commissoner & Secretary to Government, Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana, Chandigarh, addressed to all Heads of Departments, Commissioners, Ambala, Hisar, Rohtak and Gurgaon Divisions, all Deputy Commissioners & Sub Divisional Officers in Haryana and Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh.

Sub: Exclusion of socially advanced persons/sections-(Creamy Layer) from backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgement in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over-inclusion and under-inclusion in the list of backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-5-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio-economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.5.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/ sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/sections mentioned in Annexure 'A', which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

It is certified that the income from salary will not be taken into account for the purpose of income/ wealth tax in respect of service category and while calculating income or wealth test of the Government employee of Backward Classes who is not covered under Annexure-A, description of categories No. I,II (a,b,c,d) and III & IV, hence becoming entitled for the benefit of reservation under Backward Classes category, his salary should not be included but his other sources of income/wealth be included for income/wealth tax.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to Haryana Government Letter No. 22/55/90-3GS-III, dated 9-11-1994 on the subject noted above which interalia laid down that for the purpose of reservation in services, Scheduled Castes in Haryana would be put in two categories i.e. Block A and Block B in direct recruitment. These instructions had been challenged in the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court by way of Writ Petition 398 of 2004-Gajay Singh Muwal Vs. State of Haryana and other 3 Civil Writ Petitions. The Hon'ble Court vide its common judgment/orders dated 6-07-2006 has quashed the above instructions dated 9-11-1994 in the following terms :-

"We accordingly, find that the present controversy is fully covered by the decision of Supreme Court in the case E.V. Chinnaiah's case (Supra). We, accordingly, would quash the Notification No. 22/55/90-3GS-III, dated 9-11-1994 holding the same to be ultravires of the Constitution."

The State Government has filed a Special Leave Petition CC No. 1789 of 2007-State of Haryana Vs. Gajay Singh Muwal alongwith an application for staying the operation of the judgment/ orders dated 6-07-2006 of the Hon'ble High Court in the said case. Similar SLPs have been filed by some private respondents also. However, these SLPs have neither been listed for hearing nor any stay has been granted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in India, so far.

Under these circumstances the State Government on reconsideration of the matter, has decided to withdraw instructions bearing No. 22/55/90-3GS-III, dated 9-11-1994 subject to the final decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the SLPs referred to above. Consequently, there will be no categorization of the Scheduled Caste into A and B blocks. The vacancies meant for direct recruitment to reserved category of Scheduled Castes will be notified to the recruiting agencies without categorization of Scheduled Castes in A & B Blocks.

Similarly, the Govt. instructions bearing No. 22/34/98-3GS-III, dated 19-3-1999 and even number dated 5-5-1999 and letter No. 22/89/97-3GS-III dated 7-08-2000 regarding admissions in Govt. as well as in Govt. aided/self financing/Educational/Professional/Medical/Engineering/ITIs/Technical Educational Institutions and colleges will be deemed to have been modified to the extent indicated above.

It is requested that these instructions may be brought to the notice of all concerned for strict compliance.




