

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सीआरएसयू में लड़कों को भी मिलेगी हॉस्टल की सुविधा

जुलाई 2018 में शुरू होने वाले नए सेशन में चौधरी रणबीर सिंह यूनिवर्सिटी में लड़कियों के साथ-साथ लड़कों को भी हॉस्टल की सुविधा मिलेगी। यूनिवर्सिटी में बन रहे लड़कों के हॉस्टल का निर्माण पूरा हो गया है। इस पर 12 करोड़ 10 लाख की अनुमानित राशि खर्च होगी।

यूनिवर्सिटी कैंपस में 15 सितंबर 2015 को दस हजार स्क्वायर मीटर जमीन पर इस हॉस्टल का निर्माण शुरू किया गया था। फिलहाल इसका अंतिम कार्य

चल रहे हैं। हॉस्टल में ग्राउंड फ्लोर सहित रहने के लिए छह फ्लोर बनाए गए हैं। इसके अलावा अलग से डायनिंग हाल बनाया गया है। हॉस्टल के 96 कमरों में लगभग 300 विद्यार्थी रह सकेंगे।

गौरतलब है कि अभी तक यूनिवर्सिटी में केवल लड़कियों के लिए ही हॉस्टल की सुविधा है। लड़कों के लिए फिलहाल हॉस्टल की सुविधा नहीं है। इसके चलते दूसरे जिलों व प्रदेशों से यहां पढ़ने के लिए आने वाले विद्यार्थी मजबूरन कैंपस से बाहर कमरा किराये पर लेकर रह रहे हैं जो काफी महंगा पड़ता है।

UNIVERSITY PROFILE

Established by the State Legislature Act 28 of 2014 on July 24, 2014, CSRU has a sprawling campus of 75 acres situated 2 kilometres from Gohana Bypass, Jind. The university was established with the vision of imparting quality education by creating most conducive ambience for the production and dissemination of knowledge guided by innovative thinking, scientific enquiry, sublime human values, sustainable ecology, and democratic ethos. The aim of the University is the cultivation of citizens with a rich awareness of our heritage to lead and serve in every sphere of human activity. Working under the leadership of eminent educationists and social reformers, Hon'ble Chancellor Prof. Kaptan Singh Solanki and dedicated, dynamic and devoted personality Vice- Chancellor Prof. R.B. Solanki, the University is heading towards realization of its vision and the goal of being in the world ranking by 2020.

The University is affiliated u/s 2(f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956 vide letter no. 9-12/2014(CPP-I/PU) dated 26 September, 2014 and is also a member of the Association of Indian Universities. In a short span of four years, the university has many achievements to its credit. The First Convocation of the University was held on April 18, 2017. Prof. Kaptan Singh Solanki, Governor of Haryana was the Chief Guest and delivered the Convocation Address. Ch. Birender Singh, Steel Minister, Government of India, Sh. Ramesh Kaushik, Member of Parliament, Smt. Prem Lata, MLA and Sh. Jasbir Deswal, MLA were also graced the convocation as Guests of Honour. The university gave 14 Gold Medals, 13 M.Phil, 289 Post Graduates and 289 Under Graduates Degrees were awarded during the Convocation.

In addition to the academics the students are also encouraged to participate in sports events and extracurricular activities at the campus as well as outside the campus the enable their wholesome personality development.

The university has a newly constructed academic block with latest infrastructure and newly constructed Laxmi Bai Girls Hostel with ultra-modern facilities. The central library of the university has the stock of approximately 16000 books. It subscribes to National and International refereed journals, magazines and periodicals and also subscribes many Hindi and English newspapers. Round the clock internet facility is also available in the library premises. The university has an impressive Language Lab which is open for all the students of the university to help them to improve their communication skills. The university also has a Computer lab well equipped with the latest software and is networked with 32 mbps internet speed with fiber optical device. The Psychology lab of the university is spacious and fully equipped with latest equipment to carry out the tests. The Conference room of the university is equipped with world class facilities with a seating capacity of 40 persons. The construction for the extension of academic block, Second Computer Lab, Administrative Block, Boys Hostel, Sports Stadium and residential quarters for faculty is in full swing. The students of this university have shown commendable results in academics as well as co-curricular activities. With the present pace of progress, the university looks forward to having a promising future.

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

Libraries are an integral part of all educational institutes in India. The library of the university is well equipped with large numbers of books. The library has subscribed many newspapers. It is planned to shift the library to its new building from the coming session i.e. 2018-19. It will be well equipped with the modern technology and infrastructure. Recently, an E-Kiosk system has also been installed for the convenience of the students as well as faculty members. The library also provides AC reading rooms where the readers can study peacefully. The library remains open from 9.00 A.M. to 5.00 P.M. The library recorded about 500 users including students and staff of the university.

LAXMI BAI GIRLS' HOSTEL

The University has one Girls hostel named after the Queen of Jhansi, Rani Laxmi Bai. It was inaugurated by Hon'ble Governor Prof. Kaptan Singh Solanki on 12th November, 2014. It has the capacity of accommodating 240 girls. The hostel is provided with electronic gadgets including electric geysers, 32" Plasma TVs along with Dish/DTH facility and water cooler with RO system. The hostels subscribe to several national and regional dailies and magazines for enabling the students to know what is happening around the world. Sport facilities for girls include table tennis and badminton court, volley ball court, gym and different indoor games like carom-board and chess etc. Medical facilities to all hostel residents are provided through the University Health Centre located in the Hostel premises. The University also has a Horticulture Club maintained by the girls of the Hostel. Beauty and skin care clinic has been established for the grooming of the students. The hostel on the campus operates its own mess providing hygienic and nutritious meals with a varied menu. In view of the large number of students applying for hostel accommodation, the university allows hostel to the students on the basis of their merit in the admission list.

UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE

The Health Centre located in Laxmi Bai Girls Hostel has sufficient space for a dispensary with patient Beds and stools with drop stand. The centre has a visiting doctor and a nurse and provides medical consultation and free medicines to all students and staff. The health centre is well equipped with all basic apparatus and general medicines. The Health Centre also provides first line of treatment in emergency cases. The process for the full-fledged development of university health centre is in process and will be accomplished soon.

UNIVERSITY COMPUTER & INFORMATICS CENTRE (UCIC)

The University Computer & Informatics Centre (UCIC) is steadily evolving the university as "Digital University" and working rigorously to provide the excellent infrastructure facilities with High end systems controlled by Dell Make power Server. Central UPS with a power back up of 8 hours is controlling all the All-In-One Systems connected via optical fiber LAN covering the whole Campus. 24 X 7 Internet facility with 32 Mbps is available to students as well as staff. UCIC is continuously monitoring and updating all the information on university website as well as on various social media portals. It also purports to automate administrative and secretarial wings of the university with the aim to cater the needs of the entire university. University Computer & Informatics Centre (UCIC) is providing opportunity to enhance professional knowledge of students.

LANGUAGE LAB

The Language lab has been established to improve communication skills of the students. The Lab is equipped with latest software related to English Language and Communication. It provides a host of opportunities for students to work with online exercise sheets and virtual practice sessions, thus enabling them to learn language in a simulated environment.

PANDIT DEEN DAYAL UPADHAYAYA STUDENTS COMPETANCY BUILDING AND EMPOWERMENT CENTRE

To prepare students for varied professional fields, the university has established DDUC for university students as well as students/professionals from other institutions. The Cell has implemented the following schemes (i) Free UGC NET coaching (ii) Personality Development Capsule (iii) SSB coaching. Faculty members, teachers from other universities and experts from different fields are also invited to deliver extension lectures in the centre.

SC/ST CELL

The SC/ST Cell has been established for the welfare of SC/ST students of the university as per the instructions of the UGC/State Government. The Cell also functions as a Grievances Redressal Cell to redress the grievances of the SC/ST students and employees of the university. It also counsels them in solving their academic as well as administrative problems. The main objective of the SC/ST Cell is to ensure proper implementation of various schemes of University Grants Commission/Government of India/State Government introduced from time to time.

GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING CELL

The university has constituted Guidance and Counseling cell to assist the students in career areas (Knowledge of different career options through Career Talks). It also helps students in Personal areas (Stress, anxiety, lack of self- confidence, communication skills, Development of Positive attitude, Assertiveness Training, etc.).

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The university has constituted Equal opportunity cell to provide equal opportunity to all including the persons with disability. In addition, it will also examine all the possible ways in which SC/ST, OBC and all other minority groups could be helped.

VIGILANCE CELL

The university has constituted Vigilance cell to activate vigilance machinery for investigating complaints and sensitizing the university community against corruption and corrupt practices. The main objective of this cell is to prevent the possibilities of corruption and to encourage a culture of honesty and integrity.

RESEARCH CELL

The university has constituted the Research Cell to facilitate and promote quality research in emerging areas of higher education with focus on new frontiers and to act as a knowledge power- house capable of contributing to the national development and welfare of the society.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

The university has constituted the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) for planning, guiding and monitoring quality enhancement activities of the University. The cell works to instill the spirit of quality consciousness and continuous improvement of academic and administrative performance of the University and to promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices. In order to enhance the academic quality of the UTDs, the auditing of the departments is carried out from time to time. The university invites experts who suggest areas where the department needs to improve. All the internal audits are discussed in the meetings chaired by the Vice Chancellor, who provides directions for the implementation of the suggestions of the experts given in the audits.

DIRECTORATE OF YOUTH WELFARE

Directorate of Youth Welfare aims at ensuring the welfare of students by conceiving and organizing programmes for the establishment of a healthy cultural environment in the university. It motivates students to participate in various cultural activities to ensure their holistic development. Besides celebration of national festivals, the Directorate also organizes Talent Hunt Competitions.

SPORTS ACTIVITIES

Sports activities of the university are being run under the Sports Council. The university has the following playfields: Handball (1), Football (1), Volleyball (1), Netball (1), Korfbal (1), Kho- Kho (1), Kabaddi (1), & Athletic Track 400 mtrs. The university is going to have its Sports Stadium soon. The university provides different sports facilities to its players taking part in the inter university tournaments like free TA & DA, sport kit & track suit, free medical facility and scholarship to the players winning positions in these tournaments.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

National Service Scheme (NSS) promotes the spirit of voluntary work among the students and teachers through sustained community interactions. It brings academic institutions near to the society. It shows how to combine knowledge and action to achieve results, which are desirable for community development. NSS at Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University was established with the objective of providing the youth an opportunity to develop their overall personality by taking part in various Social Service Schemes. The University has initiated the process of students' enrolment. Students will be given opportunity to participate in state and national level camps. Merit certificates are provided to students, who perform well in the camps. The NSS unit organized special camp on digital financial literacy and four students also received appreciation from MHRD, Government of India.

BHARAT BODH GALLERY

The University has established Bharat Bodh Gallery for inculcating the values of National Pride and National Commitment, Teaching to live together for Social Harmony, Education about Bhartiya Sanskriti, Bhartiya Gyan and Gouravshali Bhartiya Itihas among students.

विश्व नाटक दिवस पर सीआरएस यूनिवर्सिटी में नुकड़ नाटक से किया जागरूक





PHASE-III SUBSEQUENT COUNSELING FOR VACANT/LEFTOVER SEATS IN COLLEGES OF EDUCATION

If the seats after phase-I and phase -II of counselling for B.Ed. course under Govt./ Govt. Aided/ Maintained college of Education and Self- Financing Scheme Colleges of Education still remain vacant, then, next phase of counselling i.e. Phase-III for vacant/ left over seats in all the colleges will be conducted by C.R.S. University, Jind with a late fee of Rs. 1,000/- and every candidate has to apply afresh. The candidate can register online after the last date of admission of Phase-II i.e. 11-09-2018 (after appearing advertisement in news papers/ website). However, their applications will be considered in Phase-III, only if, the seats remain vacant after counselling of Phase-II. In case the need arises, the next counselling i.e. Phase-IV will be conducted with a late fee of Rs. 2,000/- and every candidate has to apply afresh again. The cut off date for last admission will be 30-10-2018 in all respects. The schedule for filling up these vacant seats will be displayed on the website and will also be notified in two national dailies.

Cut off date for eligibility will be the last date/time of online choice filling.

Note: After subsequent counseling for vacant/leftover seats in colleges of education, no further counselling shall be conducted by the University for admission and no college shall be allowed to make admission beyond 30-10-2018 even if seats remain vacant, to meet the minimum requirement of 200 days compulsory teaching as per NCTE norms. Further the Hon'ble Punjab And Haryana High Court, Chandigarh has decided in the CWP No.-25707 of 2015 that once the last date has been notified by the admission making authority, therefore, there would be no extension under any circumstances.

 6. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to ensure eligibility for admission before applying for the course. If on verification at a later stage, it is found that a candidate does not fulfil the eligibility conditions, his/her candidature will be cancelled and the fee deposited by him/her shall be forfeited.
 7.  10. Locking of submitted choices is advisable, however, candidates who do not lock the choices, their last filled choice would be considered final.

Category, Sub-category, Group (Group-I Science & Arts with Maths, Group-II Arts & Commerce) residential status (Bonafide Residents of Haryana or All India Category), percentage of marks in qualifying examination, gender etc. submitted by the candidates at the time of registration is found to be wrong at the time of verification of the original certificates at Allotted Institutes. But, if the candidate is found to be eligible after the correction in personal data, the candidate may be considered for subsequent rounds of counseling, if any, against the vacancies only.
18. INSTRUCTIONS FOR COLLEGES

- 1. Every College/Department shall constitute an Admission Committee to be appointed by the Principal/Chairperson from amongst the teachers of College/Department.**
- 2. Verification of the documents of the candidate will be done by the respective Admission Committee of College/Department at the time of reporting for admission, by comparing with the original certificates against which candidate has been allotted seat. Any entry or information filled/ made by the candidate, if found to be false, shall entail automatic cancellation of admission.**
- 3. The admission committee may ensure that the Candidate has deposited the fee as per his / her entitlement.**
- 4. Online reporting should be done as and when candidate reports at institute and not on the last date of admission.**
- 5. After successful admission of the candidate, the institute must issue system generated provisional admission slip/ auto up-gradation letter to candidate.**
- 6. Colleges are required to update admission status online on www.crsu.ac.in, strictly as per admission schedule so that the subsequent counseling may be conducted as per schedule, failing which they will be fined heavily.**

Eligibility Conditions for Admission to B.Ed. Two Year Regular Course

Candidates with at least 50% marks either in the Bachelor Degree and /or in the Master's Degree or any other Qualification recognized as equivalent there to are eligible for admission to the programme.

Note:

- (i) There shall be no rounding off of percentage of marks of the qualifying examination from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility i.e. 49.5% and above will not be rounded off to 50%.
- (ii) 47.5% marks for SC/ST candidates of Haryana State only. As per letter dated :-16-07-2014
- (iii) 47.5% marks for Blind /Persons with Disabilities and visually/Hearing Impaired candidates.
- (iv) In case a candidate has passed the Master Degree Examination also after Bachelor Degree, the higher percentage of marks obtained in either of the two will be taken into consideration while preparing the merit
- (v) Compartmental candidates will not be allowed admission in B.Ed. (Regular Course) in any case.
- (vi) Cut off date for eligibility will be the last date/time of online choice filling.
- (vii) One year PG diploma in any subject will not be considered equivalent to Master's Degree.

PREPARATION OF MERIT LIST FOR ADMISSION

Merit for admission to B.Ed. course shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination. In case a candidate has passed the Master's Degree Examination also along with Bachelor's Degree, the higher percentage of marks obtained either in Under Graduate and Post Graduate degree will be taken into consideration while determining the merit. However, if two or more candidates have obtained equal marks, following procedure will be used for the preparation of merit.

- (i) Candidate senior in age will be given first preference
- (ii) If tie still persists, then marks obtained in 12th will be considered
- (iii) If tie still persists, then marks in 10th will be considered to break the tie

DIVISION OF SEATS

50% of the total seats in each college shall be reserved for Group-I i.e. Science & Arts with Maths-group candidates. Other 50% seats shall be reserved for Group-II i.e. Arts & Commerce Group Candidates.

In the event of quota reserved for Persons with Disabilities remain unutilized due to non availability for suitable category of Persons with disability, it may be offered to the Ex-servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

Further, 3% Horizontal reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighters and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of general category, 1% out of Scheduled Castes and 1% from backward classes' category for admissions to the various educational institutions of the Government and Government aided/institutes Located in Haryana. As far as block allocation in Block A and Block B of Backward Classes Impairment/Persons suffering from Locomotor Disability or Cerebral Palsy should be indicated clearly. For example, if Block A of Backward Classes are given seats in the Academic year 2014, the next Block i.e. B Block of category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2015 and so on. The Head of the Department concerned shall maintain the record for the purpose.

Note: A roster for reservation of Ex-Serviceman/Freedom Fighter be maintained and carry forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the years. As and when the total comes one, a seat will be provided in the prospectus. (Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana Letter No. 23/27/2004-2 GS III dated 5.12.2008 Annexure-XIII).

Subject: Regarding prescribing minimum eligibility qualification for the various courses.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Government Instructions No. 3870-WGI-ASOII-64/20069 dated 6th/9th October, 1964 whereby the candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes provided 5% reduction in marks in the minimum eligibility qualification for admissions in various courses.

It has come to the notice of the Government that at present where a General Category candidate is required to have 50% marks in a prescribed qualification for admission in any course, as per the above instructions a reserve category candidate is required to have 45% marks giving him 5% reduction in the minimum qualification. Vide judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 7084/2011, it has been observed that the practice is wrong and the relaxation of 5% should be reduced from the minimum required marks on a general category candidate for e.g. :-

In a course, a general candidate requires to have 50% marks, than as per Govt. instructions by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved caste candidate should be calculated as under :-

Out of 100 Marks needs to less = 5

Out of 1 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100

Out of 50 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100 X 50 = 2.50

This way minimum less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidates will be 50 - 2.50 = 47.50 and not 45.

All concerned are requested to implement the instructions as per the above procedure in the compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP No. 7084/2011.

Guidelines for Reservation:

1. The Reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of the Haryana Govt. and is subject to any change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.
2. All the eligible candidates whether from Haryana or from Reserved Categories shall also compete for seats allocated under All India Category.
3. All eligible candidates of reserved categories shall be considered first for Haryana Open Category seats.
4. If a candidate of Haryana Open, SC and BC category also apply for Persons with Disabilities/ ESM/DFF category will be considered first for Haryana Open, SC and BC category
5. If the reserved seat(s) of BC Block-A remain vacant, these will be filled up from BC Block-B and vice-versa.
6. Benefit of reservation will be given to all the reserved categories upto Final List according to the reservation policy given in the Prospectus. In case at the time of display of Final List the reserved seats of various categories other than S.C. category, remain vacant and no eligible candidates of the reserved categories are available, these vacant seats will be filled up on open merit basis at the time of Final List. The vacant seats of SC category will not be converted.
7. Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste will submit the certificate as per Annexure-V, the Backward Class (Block A & B) will submit the certificate on the prescribed proforma as per Annexure-VI and an affidavit shall be furnished by the candidate/both by the father and mother of the candidate as per Annexure VII, that he/she is not covered under the criteria of Creamy Layer.
8. Only those candidates having a permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the course) will be considered for admission. Persons with Disabilities will have to produce the Disability Certificate issued by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned District. However, the certificate shall be subject to verification by a Medical Board constituted by the university for the purpose. The decision of the Board shall be final. Persons with Disabilities candidates belonging to Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per Annexure-VIII. However, Medical Certificate already issued by the Competent Authority will also be considered.
9. Children & Grand-Children of Freedom Fighters of Haryana are required to submit a certificate from the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned District as per Annexure-IX at the time of admission.
10. Wards of Ex-Servicemen of Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per Annexure-X.
11. For the horizontal reservation, candidates of Haryana Open, S.C. and B.C. categories will also have to furnish E.S.M. /D.F.F. certificate.
12. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a University in the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana residents and will not be required to submit certificate of Bonafide residents of Haryana.
13. **Reservation policy is not applicable on Private Educational Institutions (SELF FINANCING SCHEME Colleges) which receive no aid from the State irrespective of the mode of Examination i.e. either by themselves or by Nodal Authority vide Memo No. 18/170-07 UNP(4) dated 27.8.2007 from Commissioner and Secretary to Government Haryana, Education Department, Chandigarh.**
14. A person belonging to the General Category married to a person belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Backward Classes, he/ she shall not be entitled to the benefit of reservation vide. Letter No. 22/57/2007-3GS-III dated 6/9/2007 from the Chief Secretary to Govt., Haryana.

ONLINE ADMISSION PROCEDURE

This section provides an overview of the steps involved in counselling and admission process.

A. Online Registration

- Candidate should visit website www.crsu.ac.in,
- Candidates should go through prospectus for gathering information/instruction in details about counselling schedules and procedures. Softcopy is available on the websites www.crsu.ac.in,
- For phase-I and phase-II candidates will register themselves as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule for Govt/ Govt Aided/ University Maintained/Self-Financing Colleges of Education in Haryana.
- For participation in online admission process, a candidate has to register by submitting personal data/requisite information correctly in the online application form. On submitting this data/ information user Id and password will be generated/ created for use in future logins by the candidate.
- For subsequent logins, candidates will be able to login directly with their user Id and password. Candidates should remember to logout at the end of their session so that the details filled by them cannot be tampered with or modified by unauthorized person.
- Candidates are advised to record/remember their password for future logins and not to disclose or share their password with anybody.
- It is solely the responsibility of the candidates to verify that their personal data including Category, Subcategory, Group (Science/ Arts with Maths & Art/Commerce), Residential Status, gender etc are consistent with documentary evidence.

C. Online Choice Filling & Locking

- ☐ For phase-I and phase-II online choice filling & locking by the candidate can be done as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule for Govt/ Govt Aided/ University Maintained /Self-Financing Colleges of Education in Haryana.

Instructions regarding Bonafide Residents of Haryana issued vide letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3rd October, 1996, No.62/32/2000-6GSI dated 23rd May, 2003, No.62/27/2003-6GSI dated 29th July, 2003 and No.62/62/2011-6GSI dated 17th January, 2012 by the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

Subject: Bonafide residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding.

1. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:-
 - (I) Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
 - (II) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/Dependents: -
 - (i) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation;
 - (ii) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
 - (iii) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government;
 - (III) Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
 - (IV) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana,
 - (V) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
 - (VI) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
 - (VII) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are :
 - (i) Citizen of India;
 - (b) Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.

(VIII) Children & Wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana.

2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-Divisions/Tehsildars of Revenue to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/Wards/Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the Children/Wards/Department of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.
4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal/Headmaster may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
5. The children/wards/dependents of the employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court, who are discharging their duties in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana and have not availed facility from their parent State, the State of Punjab and U.T. Administration Chandigarh, would also be eligible for grant of Resident Certificate of the State of Haryana only for the purpose of admission in academic/technical/medical institutions of the State of Haryana. However, in that case the employees of the Punjab & Haryana High Court shall be entitled to draw this benefit at one place/State only. Head of the Department of the Punjab & Haryana High Court would be competent to issue such a certificate.

No 808-SW(1) - In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (d) of Section 2 of the Haryana Backward Classes (Reservation in Services and Admission in Educational Institutions) Act, 2016 (15 of 2016), the Governor of Haryana hereby specify the following criteria for exclusion of creamy layer within the Backward Classes as per the Schedules appended to the Act, namely Schedule I, II & III :-

The children of persons having gross annual income of upto Three Lakh rupees shall first of all get the benefit of reservation in services and admission in educational institutions. The left out quota shall go to that class of Backward Classes of citizens who earn more than Three Lakh rupees but upto Six Lakh rupees per annum. The sections of the Backward Classes earning above Six Lakh rupees per annum shall be considered as Creamy Layer under section 5 of the said Act.
