ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Sanskrit, Pali & Prakrit was established in July, 1978. Currently the Department offers three programmes i.e. M.A. in Sanskrit, M.Phil. in Sanskrit and Ph.D. in Sanskrit. The Department provides four specializations of Sanskrit studies i.e. Vedic Literature, Sanskrit Grammar, Indian Philosophy and Classical Sanskrit Literature. The Department also offers a course on Pali & Prakrit Literature in the curriculum of M.A. Programme. The Department has well qualified and experienced faculty with full of energy and research aptitude. At present the department has 3 Professors and 4 Assistant Professors. UGC assistance is being provided for carrying research in the field of Sanskrit epic, "Valmiki Ramayana" through Special Assistance Programme (DRS level –II). The department provides quality education to its students through continuous updating of curriculum in the light of contemporary trends and requirements.

- Leverage on the scientific nature of the language to induce more people in study of Sanskrit.
- Growing interest of modern linguists in the subject.
- Growing interest of general people in Indian philosophy and value system.

Challenges

- Increasing privatization of education and the indifferent attitude of government towards the study of languages and basic subjects in general and Sanskrit in particular.
- Growing inclination of students towards technology oriented courses.
- Lack of quality subject experts coming up in the future.
- Low awareness and misconceptions about the subject.
- Lack of interests of stakeholders who are involved in developing e-contents.

ACTION PLAN

2018-19

- ✓ The Department will encourage its faculty members to attend short term courses/workshops to enhance their ability in e-learning technologies, moocs and other courses.
- ✓ Department has a computer lab with internet access. Faculty members and research scholars will be encouraged to use the ICT facilities.
- ✓ Department is planning to establish a reading room for faculty and research scholars. A separate space is already allotted for the purpose.
- ✓ Department will organize an extension lecture in the month of January 2019 to update its research scholars with new trends in research and policies of plagiarism.
- ✓ Department will organize a special lecture for general people for awareness regarding spirituality versus superstitions in the month of October 2018.
- ✓ Department will start an Add on certificate course of three months duration in communicative Sanskrit in January 2019.
- ✓ Department will make efforts to establish a seminar hall with LCD projector facility (Already available with the department). Department plans to equip it with furniture.

2019-20

- ✓ The Department will encourage its faculty members to attend refresher courses/workshops/short term courses to enhance their abilities.
- ✓ Department will establish a departmental library. The focus area will be Sanskrit epics and related books/journals.
- ✓ Department will organize a special lecture for general people regarding yoga philosophy in the month of October/November 2019.
- ✓ Department will start an Add on certificate course of three month duration in 'Yoga Philosophy' during January to March 2020.
- ✓ An alumni meet will be organized by the department in the month of March 2020. Special lectures will be organized for counseling and guidance to the students.
- ✓ Syllabus for diploma course in Pali language and literature will be prepared during this session.

2020-21

- ✓ Softwares/e-contents will be purchased during this session.
- ✓ Department will organize a special lecture for general people regarding teachings and philosophy of Swami Dayanand in the month of October/November 2020.
- ✓ A workshop will be organized by the department in the month of January 2021 to enhance the skills of students in manuscriptology.
- ✓ Department will start PG diploma course of six months duration (i.e. two semester) in Pali language and literature during the session 2020-21.
- ✓ Department will start an Add on certificate course of three months duration in Samkhya and Yoga philosophy during January to March 2021.
- Department will try to raise funds for seminars/workshops etc. through the collaboration with National Mission for Manuscripts.
- ✓ Department will complete DRS level II f SAP and apply for next phase of the SAP in Sanskrit.

2021-22

- ✓ Department will organize special lecture for general people for their awareness regarding family values in the month of October/November 2021.
- ✓ A workshop will be organized by the department in the month of January 2022 to enhance the skill of students in epigraphy.
- ✓ Department will start an Add on certificate course of three months duration in Nyaya and Vaisheshik philosophy during January to March 2022.
- ✓ Department will try to raise funds for seminars/workshops etc. through the collaboration with Archaeological Survey of India.
- ✓ An Alumni meet will be organized by the Department in the month of March 2022. Special lectures will be organized for counseling and guidance to the students.
- ✓ Department will set up a language lab to improve the communication skills of the students through the funds provided by UGC under SAP.
- ✓ Syllabus for diploma course in Prakrit language and literature will be prepared during this session.

2022-23
